philanthropic support and creates opportunities for learning, and building community  
among donors and grantees. Our areas of focus are education, environment and equity  
as seen by our support in the areas of health services and reform, civil rights and  
liberties, international development and relief services, environment, media,  
HIV/AIDS, human rights, and youth development and organizing.
